#### GENERAL INFORMATION

THE ELEVENTH SOUTHEASTERN CONSORTIUM for Continuing Medical Education in Dermatology will be held in Charlotte, North Carolina on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, September 18-20 and will be hosted by the Charlotte Dermatology Association. The educational goal of the Consortium is to update one or two areas of clinical dermatology at each meeting. Topics are selected by the Steering Committee from the list of Core Curriculum and rotate every year among the participating institutions. The complete curriculum is recycled every eight years. After selection of each broad topic, speakers are carefully chosen for each subject. Emphasis is put on choosing effective and enthusiastic teachers from the area encompassed by the Consortium.

THE TOPIC THIS YEAR: "Infectious Diseases in Dermatology"

MEETING PLACE: The meeting is hosted this year by the Charlotte Dermatology Association and will be held in the downtown Marriott Hotel. On Sunday morning, September 20th, a clinical meeting consisting of patient presentations will begin at 8:00 a.m. at the Charlotte Memorial Hospital. Transportation will be provided between the hotel and the hospital. After patients are viewed from 8:30 a.m. until 10:00 a.m., a discussion of the patients will take place in the Medical Auditorium of the Charlotte Memorial Hospital.

HERBERT Z. LUND LECTURESHIP: Dr. Bijan Safai, Chief of Dermatology at the Sloan-Kettering Cancer Hospital in New York City and a noted expert in the field of dermatoimmunology and acquired immune deficiency syndrome will give the Herbert Z. Lund Lectureship at 8:15 a.m. on Saturday morning entitled "Cutaneous Aspects of the AIDS Epidemic".

SPECIAL CLINICAL LECTURES: Dr. William Rosenberg, Professor and Chief of Dermatology at the University of Tennessee who is a noted expert in the role of infectious disease agents in papulosquamous and dermatitic diseases will deliver a special lecture on Saturday, September 19th, at 9:10 a.m. entitled "M. Ovalis, Ketoconazole, Seborrheic Dermatitis and Psoriasis". Dr. Bruce H. Thiers will also deliver a special clinical lecture on Friday, September 18, at 4:15 p.m. entitled "Current Indications and Treatment for Postherpetic Neuralgia."

CLINICAL MEETING: All Consortium meetings are held in conjunction with the presentation of patients at a clinical meeting. This year the Charlotte Dermatology Association will present patients on Sunday, September 20th, beginning at 8:30 a.m. in the Clinic Building of the Charlotte Memorial Hospital.

TRANSPORTATION: The Southeastern Consortium meeting will be held at the downtown Charlotte Marriott Hotel. All of the events on Friday and Saturday, September 18th and 19th, will take place at the hotel. On Sunday, September 20th, patient viewing and discussion of the clinical cases will take place at Charlotte Memorial Hospital in the Clinic Building and Hospital Auditorium. Shuttle bus transportation will be provided between the hotel and Charlotte Memorial Hospital on Sunday morning.

CREDIT: The American Academy of Dermatology, as an organization accredited for Continuing Medical Education, certifies that participation in the Consortium Program plus the Clinical Meeting qualifies for 13 hours of CME credit with the American Academy of Dermatology toward the Continuing Medical Education Award and toward the Physician's Recognition Award.

COCKTAIL PARTY: On Friday, September 18, there will be a cocktail party to welcome all of the SEC participants beginning at 7:00 p.m. at Discovery Place which is a "handson" natural history and science museum.

RECEPTION AND DINNER: A reception and dinner will be planned for Saturday evening and will be held at the downtown Charlotte Marriott Hotel.
