GENERAL INFORMATION

THE THIRTEENTH SOUTHEASTERN CONSORTIUM for Continuing Medical Education in Dermatology will be held in Charlottesville, Virginia on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, September 29 - October 1, 1989 and will be hosted by the Department of Dermatology of the University of Virginia. The educational goal of the Consortium is to update one or two areas of clinical dermatology at each meeting. These topics are selected from a core curriculum, and the meeting rotates every year among the participating institutions. The goal is to recycle the complete curriculum every eight years. Emphasis is placed on choosing effective and enthusiastic speakers from the region encompassed by the Consortium.

1. "Pediatric Dermatology"
2. "Cutaneous Manifestations of Systemic Diseases"

MEETING PLACE AND OVERVIEW:

The meeting is hosted this year by the Department of Dermatology at the University of Virginia. The Friday and Saturday sessions will be held at the Omni Hotel in downtown Charlottesville. On Sunday morning, October 1, a clinical meeting consisting of patient presentations will begin at 8:30 a.m. in the Department of Dermatology on the third floor of the Primary Care Center. At 10:15 a.m. a discussion of the patients will begin in Jordan Hall.

HERBERT Z. LUND LECTURESHIP:

Dr. Samuel Moschella, Senior Consultant at the Lahey Clinic and Clinical Professor of Dermatology at Harvard Medical School, will present the Herbert Z. Lund Lecture on "Lupus Erythematosus" Saturday morning at 8:10 a.m.

CLINICAL MEETING:

All Consortium meetings are held in conjunction with a clinical meeting at which patients are presented and discussed. This year the Department of Dermatology at the University of Virginia will present patients on Sunday, October 1, on the third floor of the Primary Care Center. Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. and patient presentations will begin at 8:30 a.m.

CREDIT:

The American Academy of Dermatology, as an organization accredited for continuing medical education, certifies that participation in the Consortium Program plus the

Clinical Meeting qualifies for 13 hours of CME credit with the American Academy of Dermatology toward the continuing medical education award and toward the Physician's Recognition Award.
