The Fourteenth Southeastern Consortium for Continuing Medical Education in Dermatology will be held in Winston-Salem, North Carolina on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, September 14-16, 1990 and will be hosted by the Department of Dermatology at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University. The educational goal of the Consortium is to update one or two areas of clinical dermatology at each meeting. These topics are selected from a core curriculum, and the meeting rotates every year among the participating institutions. The goal is to recycle the complete curriculum every eight years. Emphasis is placed on choosing effective and enthusiastic speakers from the region encompassed by the Consortium.

The meeting is hosted this year by the Department of Dermatology at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University. On Sunday morning, September 16, 1990, a clinical meeting consisting of patient presentations will begin at 8:30 a.m. in the New Clinical Sciences Building - the exact location will be announced at the meeting and will be posted at the meeting. Clinical Meeting:

All Consortium meetings are held in conjunction with a clinical meeting at which patients are presented and discussed. This year the Department of Dermatology at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University will present patients on Sunday, September 16, in the new Clinical Sciences Building (the exact location will be announced at the meeting). Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. and

patient presentations will begin at 8:30 a.m. The discussion of patients will start at 10:15 a.m. on the "E" floor of the Hanes Building in the Babcock Auditorium.
