PURPOSE

The educational goal of the Consortium is to provide an update for dermatologists in one or two areas of clinical dermatology selected from a core curriculum. Featured speakers are selected from the region encompassed by the Consortium, and the meeting rotates annually among participating institutions. The Department of Dermatology at the University of Virginia School of Medicine is the host for this year's conference, and the meeting will provide an update in diagnostics and therapeutics.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

As a result of attending the conference, participants will be able to:

- 1. Determine the diagnostic applications of PCR:
- 2. Discuss diagnosis and treatment of common diseases arising in the mouth;
- 3. Evaluate latex allergy, including necessary testing;
- 4. Review common vulvar dermatoses and treatment;
- 5. Review indications for referring for Mohs surgery;
- 6. Discuss and review case studies in dermatology.

ACCREDITATION

The University of Virginia School of Medicine is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to sponsor continuing medical education for physicians.
