The Twenty-fifth Southeastern Consortium for Continuing Medical Education in Dermatology will be held in Durham, North Carolina, on Friday – Sunday, October 5-7, 2001. The meeting will be hosted by the Division of Dermatology of Duke University Medical Center. The educational goal of the Consortium is to provide an update in one or two areas of clinical dermatology selected from a core curriculum. The meeting rotates every year among the participating institutions. This year's Southeastern Consortium will be held in conjunction with a Callaway Club reunion and thus many of the speakers are nationally recognized experts from outside the Southeastern Consortium area.

The Southeastern Consortium for Dermatology has an annual named lectureship to honor Dr. Herbert Z. Lund Dr. Lund was founding Chief of Pathology at Moses H. Cone Hospital, Co-founder and past President of the American Society of Dermatopathology and teacher of dermatopathology to Duke and UNC dermatology residents for over 30 years. This year's Herbert Z. Lund lecturer is Dr. David A. Whiting. Dr. Whiting is both a Board Certified Dermatologist and Dermatopathologist, founder/Director of the Baylor Hair Research and Treatment Center and immediate past President of the North American Hair Research Society. He will speak on "Cicatricial Alopecia."

A special named lectureship in honor of Dr. J. Lamar Callaway has been initiated by the Duke Callaway Club. Dr. Callaway was the first chairman of the Division of Dermatology and remained chairman until 1975. He remained on the Duke Faculty until his death in 1995. He was a past President of the American Academy of Dermatology and the Society for Investigative Dermatology and received both the Gold Medal of the AAD and the Rothman award from the SID. Dr. Callaway is best remembered for his special rapport with patients, clinical skills and teaching ability. This year we have two Callaway lecturers. Dr. Richard Scher is the immediate past President of the AAD and a noted author and lecturer on nail disorders. His talk is entitled "Nail Pearls from New York - Interesting Cases: You Make the Diagnosis." Dr. Madeleine Duvic is a former Duke resident who is the head of Dermatology at the M.D. Anderson Hospital in Houston, Texas Cancer Center. She is an expert in a wide-ranging field of cutaneous immunologic disorders including Cutaneous T-cell Lymphoma (CTCL). Her lecture is entitled "Molecular Advances in the Diagnosis of CTCL".

This year's Southeastern Consortium marks the establishment of the Dr. and Mrs. Paul Cook Visiting Professor at Duke. Lisa Beck, a former Duke Resident and current faculty member at Johns Hopkins University, is this year's awardee. She is an expert on atopic dermatitis and her lecture is entitled "Atopic Dermatitis in the New Century".
