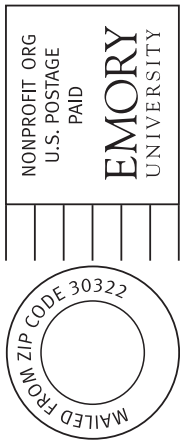

General Information

Program Description

This symposium is designed for dermatologists in private practice and academia, dermatology residents and fellows, nurse practitioners and physician assistants specializing in dermatology. The program includes half day didactic sessions on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning, and patient viewing followed by case discussion on Sunday.

The SEC consists of ten member institutions in the southeastern region of the United States. The purpose of the annual SEC program is to support the education, collaboration and camaraderie of dermatologists in the Southeast. This year's meeting will highlight aspects of general dermatology, pediatric dermatology and recent updates in the field of dermatology.

At the conclusion of this program, the participant should be able to:

- Explain the utility of ELISAs for diagnosis of select immunobullous diseases.
- Enhance their knowledge of T and B cell molecular clonality results in the setting of cutaneous atypical lymphocytic infiltrates.
- Identify new molecular markers for the diagnosis of melanoma.
- Improve knowledge and understanding of select aspects of phototherapy.
- Describe infectious disease screening and treatment recommendations for patients who may require immunosuppressives for cutaneous disorders.
- Employ the tools and approaches used to explain risk to patients.
- Identify strategies for enhancing the physician patient interaction.
- Describe food allergies in pediatric patients.
- Identify new cutaneous signs of systemic disease in pediatric patients.
- Identify common infestations in children.

Participation in the course satisfies the American Academy of Dermatology Maintenance of Certification requirement of dermatology related Category 1 credits.

Poster Submission

Poster abstracts for the meeting are now being accepted for review. Prizes will be awarded to the most outstanding posters. Posters will be judged based on their educational value, organization and clarity.

Tuition

Tuition is \$275 for dermatologists and mid-level providers (physician assistants and nurse practitioners) and \$125 for residents and students. A maximum enrollment has been set so early registration is encouraged. Written cancellations prior to October 7th will be refunded less an administrative fee of \$50. There are no refunds after October 7th, but substitutions will be accepted.

Course Locations and Lodging

Sessions on Friday and Saturday will be held at the InterContinental Buckhead Atlanta, 3315 Peachtree Road, Atlanta, Georgia, 30326.
